#### WINTER UNIFORM AS OF NOVEMBER 1st

Our winter uniforms are to be worn starting this Friday, November 1st for anyone not participating in the free Tag Day.

<u>Boys</u>: long navy blue permanent press pants belted at the waist, white dress shirt or golf shirt with school insignia.

<u>Girls:</u> skirt (6-8) or jumper (K-5) white peter pan collar blouse or golf shirt (K-5) white button down collar oxford cloth short or long sleeve blouse or golf shirt with school insignia (6-8).

Girls and boys in grades 6, 7 & 8 must wear the navy sweater vest with school insignia as part of the winter uniform.

If students in grades K-5 need a sweater for warmth during the school day, it must be the long sleeve, v-neck or cardigan sweater with school insignia. White or navy blue tights, leggings, or FAW sweatpants may be worn under skirts or jumpers on cold days. During the winter uniform period, girls also have the option of wearing navy blue permanent press dress pants with stitched belted waistband and a plain brown or black belt in place of the skirt or jumper.

If you would like to discuss your child's progress with any of the specials class teachers, please contact them directly to request a day/time to meet.



**Handbook Highlight:** "On designated days ("tag days"), students may be given permission by the principal to wear clothing other than their uniforms to school. Students must abide by the following on tag days:

- Clothing must be modest and appropriate
- Shirts may not have inappropriate words or pictures on them
- Pants must be clean and properly sized for both girls and boys
- Tank tops, tops with spaghetti straps, or crop tops that leave the midriff area bare above the waistband are not permitted
- Shorts or skirts may not be more than three inches above the knee
- Leggings can only be worn when paired with a top long enough for modest, appropriate coverage
- Jeans should fit properly around the waist
- Jeans that are ripped or have holes are not permitted
- Pants or skirts that expose bare skin are not permitted

Parents may be called to bring a uniform to school for any student who the principal determines is dressed inappropriately. Normal daily school rules regarding accessories, jewelry and make-up will apply on tag days."
