Handbook Highlight: "As a Catholic school our faith is integrated throughout everything we do. As part of our mission, we strive to educate the whole child and foster character formation through instruction in the commandments and virtues. One of the ongoing virtues that we emphasize is honesty. This means honesty in all that we say, in the work we do, and in taking responsibility for our behavior. Honesty in our work means that we will always do our own work, whether it is class work, homework, projects, or tests. Cheating on any of these forms of work is a serious act. We define cheating as taking the work of someone else and presenting it as your own. This includes direct copying of homework answers from another person, taking information from an internet source or other reference and passing it on word-for-word as if you wrote it, asking for or offering to share answers on a guiz or test, or any other way in which you have not been responsible for completing your own assignments. Helping or accepting help from another person means you have worked together to solve problems or find information and then turned in work that you have spent time and effort to make your own. Giving direct answers is not helping. It is cheating. Plagiarism is cheating and students receive instruction about what plagiarism is and the serious consequences for plagiarizing written work. Consequences for cheating include, but are not limited to, students not receiving any credit for the assignment, not having the opportunity to make-up the work, parents being notified, and lunch/recess or after school detention."

#### ST. MARY'S BABE RUTH/CAL RIPKEN LEAGUE

It is with great pleasure we announce that the **St. Mary's Babe Ruth/Cal Ripken League** will again provide a baseball program for students attending Middle Schools in the spring of 2020. Games in this league will be played on full regulation 90' baseball fields.

This year students from all St Mary's County Catholic Schools, The Kings Christian Academy, and St Mary's Bryantown School will be eligible to try out. This is an after school activity. Babe Ruth League, Inc. includes approved accident insurance that is primary coverage – not secondary. Our program provides students with the opportunity to stay involved in organized baseball, while sharpening their skills against competition in their own age group or grade level, preparing for high school.


