



## Father Andrew White School 2020 Summer Reading and Math Instructions

Dear FAW Students and Families of Rising Grades 1-5,

Summer is just around the corner and with its arrival comes the opportunity to plan for great summer reading choices. We encourage our children to continue to make reading an important part of their daily schedule, even during the summer. To help with this, I encourage you to visit the public library when it opens. There are also many online options available and we have our FAW Virtual Book Fair going on through September.

Our summer reading program consists of **reading, a project assignment and IXL**. **First, all students should read at least 2 books (one required and one of your choice)**. You may certainly read more, and be sure to keep a log of your reading to share with your teacher. The required books and IXL lessons are as follows, by grade (for 2020-2021):

Grade 1 - Pedro, First-Grade Hero by Fran Manushkin **AND** 7 Math and 7 Language Arts IXL lessons at the Kindergarten level. You may choose which 7 lessons of each to complete.

Grade 2 - My Soccer Mom From Mars by Rita Book **AND** 7 Math and 7 Language Arts IXL lessons at the 1st Grade level. You may choose which 7 lessons of each to complete

Grade 3- To the Future, Ben Franklin (AR level 3.5) by Mary Pope Osborne OR Benjamin Franklin: A Nonfiction Companion to To the Future, Ben Franklin (AR level 5.5) by Mary Pope Osborne **AND** 7 Math and 7 Language Arts IXL lessons at the 2nd Grade level. You may choose which 7 lessons of each to complete.

Grade 4- Ribsy by Beverly Cleary **AND** 20 Math and 20 Language Arts IXL lessons at the 3rd Grade level. You may choose which 20 lessons of each to complete.

Grade 5- Restart (AR level 5.1) by Gordon Korman OR The 6th Grade Nickname Game (AR level 4.3) by Gordon Korman **AND** 20 Math (from the Saxon Math level 5 or 6 that you were in this year) and 20 Language Arts IXL Lessons (5th Grade) . You may choose which 20 lessons of each to complete.

**After reading the required book for your grade, each student should complete either a diorama or a descriptive poster showing your favorite part of the story.** These projects will be displayed in the library and will be shared with your class during library time.

Have a great summer and thank you for making reading a family priority.
